HOSPICE Documentation Checklist Tool Face-to-Face (if applicable) On or after January 1, 2011 a face-to-face is required for all beneficiaries entering their third or later benefit period Did the face-to-face encounter occur no more than 30 days before the third benefit period

Hospice Documentation Audit Tool

Does documentation indicate a minimum of 8 hours of care during a 24-hour day, which begins and ends at midnight? Do the hospice aide hours exceed the nursing hours? Are continuous care units billed after death of the patient? GIP: Is general inpatient care billed? Is the precipitating event documented?

HOSPICE DOCUMENTATION: PAINTING THE PICTURE OF THE ...

DOCUMENTATION OF APPETITE Appetite usually is a good indicator of decline in a hospice patient Avoid documentation of good, fair or poor appetite This cannot be measured Instead give the number of meals that the patient ate per day along with the % of intake of each meal Get down to even describing the meal provided in

Hospice services are covered as part of your Medicaid benefits[22] Services are provided by a team to meet your needs The hospice team may include you, your family, and others who can help meet your physical, psychosocial, spiritual, and emotional needs Your needs are written in a plan of care (POC), also called a plan[23]

Hospice Clinical Documentation

Hospice Coverage • Clinical documentation requirement for hospice coverage: - Patient record must support documentation in technical elements • Terminal prognosis of 6 months or less • LCD criteria - Days in any billing period without corresponding documentation showing eligibility are unpaid

Medicare rules and regulations addressing hospice services require the documentation of sufficient “clinical information and other documentation” to support the certification of individuals as having a terminal illness with a life expectancy of 6 or fewer months, if the illness runs its normal course
